MINISTER'S NEW YEAR MESSAGE

We come into the New Year with thankfulness and perhaps with a sense of the fear of the unknown. The year that has closed we leave behind with its pains and sorrows as well as with its blessings and joys. The Word of God reminds us that "there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 1:9) but in many ways 2021 has been a year of unprecedented challenges and difficulties. The COVID-19 pandemic has meant the loss of many lives, has affected the long-term health and wellbeing of friends and families across the country, and has left us with an ongoing economic crisis. This is on top of what we might describe as the regular challenges of our generation and times – political unrest and instability, the increasing absence of biblical morality, and the marginalisation of Christianity and the teaching of the Word of God.

Humanly speaking, we have so many reasons to be discouraged! But our encouragement comes from the Word of God and the example of the people of God in past generation. The Apostle Paul is our greatest human example of living in a world like ours and coping with the challenges confronting every generation. Remarkably, he was able to say that he was "content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities" (2 Corinthians 12:10); he was also able to say that his afflictions were "light and momentary" (2Corinthians 4:17). He was able to say this only because he trusted in a remarkable God, who loved with a remarkable love, and who saves through a remarkable Saviour. His whole approach to life was forward-looking and heaven inspired as he "looked at the things that are unseen...eternal" (2 Corinthians 4:18).

We have an insight into how his mind and Christian faith worked in his letter to the Philippians – "one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13-14). In the past year, we have all had things that we would like to forget, but perhaps these very same things are unforgettable. Some are unforgettable because of the joy they brought to us; and some are unforgettable because of the pain and sorrow they brought to us. In the mystery that is God's providence, we believe that everything God gave us was to encourage us to look forward and upwards, follow in the footsteps of Paul, "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13-14).

May this coming year be a year when we find grace, mercy and peace from God our Saviour; a year when our delight is in God. And as we go forward seeking to be pleasing to Him, we could do worse than adopt the following prayer of the Puritan Robert Hawkins (1753-1857), in the classic language of his day, and which he prayed to God as 'To the Gardener of my Soul':

'Oh, precious Jesus—may I be no longer unfruitful in your garden! Lord, do as you have said. Dig around me, and pour on me all the sweet influences of your Holy Spirit—which, like the rain, the sun, and the dew of heaven, may cause me to bring forth fruit to God.

And, Lord, if you will listen to an unworthy creature like me plead for others, let the coming year bring the same blessings to all your redeemed—even to my unawakened relatives, and to thousands who are still in darkness.

I pray that this may be to them the acceptable year of the Lord! Amen.

COVID RESTRICTIONS

The Scottish Government COVID-19 Restrictions Guidance for Places of Worship was updated on 9th December and 16th December with no substantial changes but with general advice for good practice. We continue to observe the one-metre physical distancing in our services in line with the advice from the Scottish Government and to help allay people's anxieties in public gatherings in the light of the ongoing presence of the COVID-19. We will also continue the practice of taking a register of all those attending our services. We must be vigilant in observing all the public health guidelines as our communities continue to suffer from COVID-19 and the current omicron variant.
