COVID RESTRICTIONS

The First Minister announced this week that as from Monday 4th April, the legal requirement to wear a face covering in places of worship will be removed. This includes marriage ceremonies, funeral services, and commemorative events, such as a memorial service. It also includes those ceremonies that take place in venues other than places of worship.

We welcome this development and this further step to normality after the restrictions of the past two years. However, we continue to be concerned about the high number of COVID-19 cases in our communities at this time. If anyone attending our services feels anxious about the ongoing COVID-19 situation, and wearing a face covering helps to allay such anxiety, please feel free to continue using your face covering. We will continue to observe the one-metre physical distancing in our services in the meantime to further help allay people's anxieties in public gatherings.
