SPONSOR A CAMP

- 3. Most leaders will be able to meet this Saturday (18th) in Perth both in person and some online for a planning meeting. We would value prayer for safe travels and for guidance as we prepare talks, devotions and praise.
- 4. Minibuses and transport for all camps are proving to be a great challenge this year following the pandemic some options for transport companies that have been reliable and used in the past by Free Church Camps are no longer available.
