LORD'S DAY SERVICES - CHURCH RE-OPENING

We are thankful that we return to Church this Lord's Day, 4th April 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English.

Church Attendance

The attendance at all Church services of public worship is limited to fifty due to the COVID-19 restrictions. Seats will be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. Mr Donald MacPhail, Deacon, is the Seating Coordinator for the Church services and enquiries regarding attendance should in the first place be directed to him.

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

LIVE STREAMING OF SERVICES

We are pleased to announce that the installation and testing of the live streaming equipment in the Church has now been completed and that we are ready to 'go live' with our services. The live stream will be available for the 12.00noon service this Lord's Day, 4th April 2021, on the Shawbost Free Church of Scotland YouTube channel by clicking here. We will continue to use the Sermon Audio site for audio recordings and, once the live stream equipment setup is fully functional, we will use the Sermon Audio Webcast function to live stream the services to both platforms. WOMEN FOR MISSION

The Women for Mission (WfM) was established over 100 years ago to promote the growth of the Christian faith by encouraging interest in mission as well as giving practical support to the Church's mission work in Scotland and around the globe. WfM seeks to do this in three ways: (1) by raising funds for mission projects which seek to offer help in areas of health, education, poverty and disaster around the world; (2) by encouraging women of all ages in the Free Church of Scotland to use their gifts to support mission; (3) by facilitating prayer and support for home and international mission.

Every year, WfM organises a fundraising project that everyone in the Church can get involved in. Through the funds raised, we are able to provide direct support to a wide range of mission work both at home and abroad. The theme for 2020/2021 is *Embracing the World with the Touch of the Gospel*. The focus of the fundraising this year is on The Leprosy Mission in India, Scripture Union Scotland, Moldova Support Group, and WfM Disaster and Relief Fund.

Many churches and individuals have already done a fantastic and very creative job in raising money towards the WfM projects in the midst of these challenging circumstances. PRESBYTERY PRAYER TIME

The Bible passage and prayer points for Monday 5th April 2021 have been chosen by the **Rev. James Maciver**, Minister at Stornoway. The Bible Passage is **Genesis 45:25-46:4** and the following are the prayer points.

Prayer points:

- 1. That, as Jacob's spirit revived when he realised that Joseph was still alive, so our spirits may be revived as we think of Christ's resurrection from the dead.
- 2. That, like Jacob here, we as God's people would be given a fresh view of God, especially as the covenant Overlord of his people who directs all events for their benefit.
- 3. That God would reveal himself powerfully to those who lead us as a nation and direct them to give due recognition to his lordship and to his word.
- 4. That we will hold to the conviction that God can create blessing in a context of darkness and fear, as he assured Jacob would be the case with him in Egypt.
- 5. That, as in the testing circumstance of being surrounded by pagan idolatry God would multiply his believing people, pray that he would also do this for his Church under the Covid pandemic.

- 6. That God would relieve the fear and apprehension many people have over our gradual emergence from lockdown conditions.
- 7. That God would give his people further assurance of his presence with them going into, during and coming out of times of testing.
- 8. That we may be increasingly thankful to God for his continuing goodness to us.

Prayer Points:

- I. Within a couple of months of entering a vacancy the congregation was plunged into the first Covid 19 lockdown; challenging when you have a minister let alone when the congregation is vacant. We are thankful to God for our Interim Moderator and would ask prayer for him and for the congregation as we seek to fill the vacancy as God will direct us.
- 2. More than most, the elderly and those living alone have been adversely affected by the lockdown, but we would also value your prayers for our young folks as their education and social interfacing has been significantly impacted, having potential unforeseen consequences well into the future. We would ask that you uphold our student contingent as we look forward to a time when they are able to return to normal studies.
