ATTENDANCE AT SUNDAY SERVICES

Coronavirus Protection Level 0

The Western Isles is now in Level 0 of Scottish Government COVID-19 restrictions. Congregational singing is now permitted. A capacity limit, determined by the size of the building and the observance of the 2-metre physical distancing rules, still applies regarding attendance at Church services. The physical distancing rules are under review and there are indications that they may be reduced to 1 metre on 19th July 2021, and that they might be lifted completely on 9th August 2021, depending on circumstances prior to these dates.
