INTRODUCTION

We are a congregation of the Free Church of Scotland. We gather for public worship on the Lord's Day at 12.00noon and at 6.00pm. We use the ESV version of the Bible in the public worship of God. We use both the Scottish Psalter and Sing Psalms versions of the Psalms for the praise items in our public worship. SUNDAY SERVICES

The 12.00noon service will be taken by the Minister. We will continue our study of I Peter at the **12.00noon service**. The theme is 'The Christian's Faithfulness to Christ in a Hostile World.' This week's sermon is based on I Peter 1:22-2:3 under the title 'Christian Conduct & Life in God's Family.'

At the **6.00pm service** we will continue our study on the life and purpose of the Church. The vision of the Free Church is to have 'A Healthy Gospel Church in every Community in Scotland.' We want to look at what the Word of God has to say about the Healthy Gospel Church and what it looks like in practice. This week we will look at I Corinthians 12:12-26 under the title 'The Church – The Unity & Diversity of the Body.'

With this blessing, there are challenges, which include limited space for meeting -- please pray for wisdom in addressing these challenges. Also, pray for the growing relationships with parents, that they, as well as their children, will see the love of Jesus in the helpers at Friday Club and that they in turn will come to know and love our Saviour

Tuesday - Matthew and Maria Lingard, Athena

Thank God for his explicit answers to many prayers, and for bringing around us such a solid support base of praying brothers and sisters from so many different places. We have many testimonies from the last couple months where prayers (big and small) have been answered so quickly and directly that it's been wonderful to see and share

Wednesday - Urray and Strathconnon

Youth work: In recent weeks we have been encouraged by the attendance of unchurched youngsters to our Sunday school. Please pray that this would continue and that our teachers would have the skills and wisdom to communicate the gospel in suitable ways. We are also recommencing our youth club after covid and would appreciate prayers for this.

Thursday - Dumisani

Pray for Dumisani students engaged in village and town ministries around the Eastern Cape province. May a good integration occur between their work in the Dumisani classroom and with congregational ministries.

Friday - Matthew and Maria Lingard, Athens

A Christian Iranian friend (you can pray for him simply as 'O') was jailed because the police stopped him without having his residency papers on him. We took him his most basic belongings yesterday that he is allowed (only 4

plastic bags of stuff). His situation looks difficult. Please pray for God's intervention to get him out of there, and for God's glorification and 'O's growth in faith through this situation.

Saturday - Richard and Barbara, a European City

Pray for Amanda and her family. She and the three youngest boys (ages 10, 12 and 14) returned from the islands last month. Her marriage situation is extremely complicated and her husband is now living with a different wife. She has many heartaches; this is one more. We are thankful to be able to visit each week, open the Scriptures and help in practical ways. Pray that she will hear Christ's voice. We are currently working through the story of Joseph. Amanda's grasp of French is rudimentary but we have this portion available in her language on a phone app. She listens to it with great interest. Pray too for the boys, surrounded by many bad influences, to be kept from evil.

Sunday - Urray and Strathconnon

That our Elders and Deacons would know how to lead the congregation through the spiritual, and now economic, crisis gripping our land.
