# LORD'S DAY SERVICES – CHURCH ATTENDANCE

We are thankful to gather in the Church this Lord's Day, 9<sup>th</sup> May 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English.

## A Capacity Limit

The Scottish Government introduced a capacity limit, while still observing the 2-metre physical distancing rules, instead of the previous cap of 50 people, as part of the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions in Protection Level 3 on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2021. This will enable larger buildings, with greater floor area and seating capacity, to accommodate more while still maintaining the 2-metre physical distancing. The numbers permitted to attend funerals and wedding services is also to be increased to a maximum of 50 from 26<sup>th</sup> April.

# **Ongoing Registration**

The introduction of a capacity limit instead of the cap of 50 people attending Church services is unlikely to affect the maximum number we can accommodate in the Church until such time as the upstairs is opened for use. Seats will, therefore, continue to be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. The arrangements for registering your intention to attend the services, and to complete the relevant documentation, have been set up on the Congregational Website <u>here</u>.

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

# LIVE STREAMING OF SERVICES

The **live stream of the 12.00noon English service** this Lord's Day, 9<sup>th</sup> May 2021, will be available on the **Shawbost Free Church of Scotland YouTube Channel** by clicking <u>here</u>. We will continue to use the Sermon Audio site for audio recordings and, once the live stream equipment setup is fully functional, we will use the Sermon Audio Webcast function to live stream the services to both platforms.

The **pre-recorded video of the Gaelic Service** will also be available on our **YouTube Channel at 10.30am on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> May 2021**. This is the first Sunday of a trial period of making a video of the Gaelic service available in this way and its continuance will be based on demand.

## **Sunday Services**

This Lord's Day we commence a study of *The Christian's Experience of Grace* as a follow up on our study of *How* we become Christians in the Gospel of John earlier in the year. The first sermon in the series is from Micah 7:18-20 under the title *The Incomparable God*.

## **Availability of Services**

An audio recording of the English service in the Church will be available on Sermon Audio at 2.00pm. The service in Gaelic has been pre-recorded and an audio-only version of Gaelic service and will be available on Sermon Audio at 12.00noon. Services are accessed on the <u>Shawbost Free Church Sermon Audio</u> by simply clicking or tapping on Shawbost Free Church Sermon Audio underlined above or by going to the Congregational Website.

The pre-recorded Gaelic Service will also be available as usual on the Twilio service, which can be **accessed** from landline / home telephone by dialling the number 0131 510 2471. Please note that there is <u>a delay of</u> <u>approximately 35 seconds</u> from the time at which the call is answered until the service commences.

# PASTORAL VISITATION

#### PRESBYTERY PRAYER TIME

The Bible passage and prayer points for Monday 10th May 2021 have been chosen by Rev. Hugh Ferrier, Minister of the High Free Church in Stornoway. The **Scripture Reading** is **Haggai Chapter 1**.

In these verses we find the LORD's people returning to their homeland following their exile in Babylon. However, they're too traumatised to go about the LORD's work of rebuilding His temple (2) and instead spend their energies on rebuilding their own homes (4). The LORD, through Haggai, calls on them consider their priorities (7) and to engage in His work (8-11). The people respond to the LORD's word and

engage in His work (12). At the same time, they engage in this work assured by the LORD's Promise that He's with them (13) and stirred by His Spirit (14).

As we find ourselves slowly coming out of Lockdown are we making it our priority to be about Christ's Kingdom work?

#### **Prayer Points:**

1. Please remember your ministers in prayer. Some of them may be discouraged and wondering if they can keep on going in the pastoral ministry. Others may be tiring in the work and on the verge of burnout and while not seeing it their minds and bodies may feel it. Others may be running on empty from a year of ministering in such challenging circumstances and feel that they have little to give.

2. Please remember the elders and deacons of our congregations in prayer. We pray that that they would have wisdom in knowing what they should be doing and what they might have to hold back from doing as congregations. Some of these decisions may be difficult and so please pray for unity.

3. Please remember those who have cooled off and begun to drift from the life of the Church over the past year. We pray that their hearts would once more be warmed to the Gospel of Grace and that they'd once again have the desire for fellowship with the Lord and His People.

4. Finally please pray for the evangelistic witness of each congregation in this season. The restricted numbers at our services mean that it's hard to invite people to a Church Service or event. At the same time people may be reluctant to even sign up for a Church Service if given the opportunity. Please be praying that the Lord's people would be "stirred up" to seek to make Him known to those whom they come into contact with and that they would find opened and receptive hearts.
