PSALM 124 AND THE DELIVERANCE OF THE ALLIED ARMIES AT DUNKIRK

The deliverance of the allied armies at Dunkirk is considered by many to be a true story of Divine providence in modern history. King George VI had ordered the observance of a National Day of Prayer. The British Monarch, along with members of the cabinet, attended Westminster Abbey to pray, while millions of Britons all across the Kingdom in unprecedented unity, attended churches to join the King in prayer. Newspapers throughout the UK reported, "Nothing like it has ever happened before."

Following the evacuation of Dunkirk, Winston Churchill addressed the British nation and described the evacuation as a "miracle of deliverance." The following Sunday, the nation in celebration of God's answer to prayer, sang Psalm 124 throughout churches in the United Kingdom.

The phrase, "If the Lord had not been our side", is repeated twice in the first two verses of Psalm 124. The following is a quote from Martin Luther regarding this passage of scripture: "This repetition is not in vain. For whilst we are in danger, our fear is without measure, but when it is once past, we imagine it to have been less than it was indeed. And this is the delusion of Satan, to diminish and obscure the grace of God."

In Psalm 124, David gives God the glory for their victory, reminding us that our strengths and weaknesses mean nothing unless we have the provision of God.
