LORD'S DAY SERVICES – CHURCH RE-OPENING

We are thankful that we are again able to gather in the Church this Lord's Day, 11th April 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English.

Church Attendance

The attendance at all Church services of public worship is limited to fifty due to the COVID-19 restrictions. Seats will be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. Mr Donald MacPhail, Deacon, is the Seating Coordinator for the Church services and enquiries regarding attendance should in the first place be directed to him.

Ongoing Registration

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

LORD'S DAY SERVICES – IIth APRIL 2021

Sunday Services

This Lord's Day and next we will look at the two key aspects of the Christian's participation in the resurrection of Christ. This week we will look at Ephesians 2:4-7 and *The Christian & A First Resurrection*.

THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH

The whole nation is reflecting on the life of the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, since Her Majesty The Queen announced his passing away peacefully at Windsor Castle on the morning of Friday 9th April 2021 at the age of ninety-nine years, just two months short of his 100th birthday. Prince Philip married the then Princess Elisabeth on 20th November 1947 and was her devoted husband for over seventy-three years. He was a loyal and faithful consort of Queen Elisabeth since her accession to the throne on 6th February 1952. The Duke was well respected in the UK and in the Commonwealth. The initiative perhaps for which he is best known locally is the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme of which he was Founder and Patron. Many of our young people benefitted from the Scheme under the leadership of Kenny Smith, Catherine Ann Campbell, and others. We remember the Queen and the Royal Family in our prayers at this time of grief and sorrow.

HONG KONG READY

The Church's Mission Board has forged links with the Hong Kong Ready initiative. There is great political turmoil in Hong Kong as the Chinese communist party turn their attention to integrating the British Colony of Hong Kong into mainland China. This has resulted in great unrest and will lead to mass migration. This year the Home Office estimates that 130,000 will migrate from Hong Kong to the UK following the introduction of a new visa which will make it easy for Hong Kong residents to come to the UK.

The UKHK initiative is a movement in the UK Church which aims to equip local churches to be Hong Kong Ready – to be ready to show hospitality to those who are coming into the UK from Hong Kong. PRESBYTERY PRAYER TIME

The Bible passage and prayer points for Monday 12th April 2021 have been chosen by the **Rev. Thomas Penman**, Minister at South Uist and Benbecula. The Bible Passage is **Isaiah 40** and the following are the prayer points.

Prayer Points:

- 1. Praise God for His perfect sovereignty, wisdom and might.
- 2. Praise God that he both 'comes with might' against his enemies and tenderly cares for 'his flock like a shepherd'.
- 3. Give thanks that the Lord knows we are weak and that He gives strength to the weary.
- 4. Pray for the spread of the gospel in the Western Isles and across Scotland so that many more would be ready for the Lord's return and His name would be glorified.
- 5. Pray against the evils of alcoholism and drug use which lock down has exacerbated.
- 6. Pray the virus would continue to decrease and that we would not return to lockdown in the future.
- 7. Pray for our young people and their teachers as schools return to full time hours.
- 8. Pray that our political leaders would have wisdom as they lead the nation, beginning with a right fear of God.
- 9. Pray for peace in Northern Ireland and an end to the rioting there. Pray for the spread of the gospel in all parts of Ireland.
- 10. Pray for the Queen and the Royal Family as they grieve the loss of Prince Philip.
