INTRODUCTION

We are a congregation of the Free Church of Scotland. We gather for public worship on the Lord's Day at 12.00noon and at 6.00pm. We use the ESV version of the Bible in the public worship of God. We use both the Scottish Psalter and Sing Psalms versions of the Psalms for the praise items in our public worship. SUNDAY SERVICES

The service today will be taken by the Minister. This Lord's Day we will continue a series of sermons on some of the promises of the coming of the Son of God into the world and how these promises unfold in the New Testament. At the 12.00noon services we will focus on some Old Testament promises and at the 6.00pm services we will look at how these promises are fulfilled in the birth, life and work of the Lord Jesus in the New Testament. The title of the series is *The Unfolding of God's Promises in the Life of Jesus*.

At the **12.00noon service today** we will study Isaiah 7:1-17 and the promise of the virgin birth of Jesus. The sermon title is *The Unfaithful King & God's Intervention*.

At the **6.00pm service** today we will study Luke 1:26-38 and look at the words spoken by the angel to Mary to explain the conception of Jesus. The title of the sermon is *The Virgin Mary & God's Intervention*.
