PRAAYER POINTS 5th JANUARY – 11th JANUARY 2026

Monday 5th January - Muriel Macleod, Cambodia

Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will ignite hearts to worship and to make God known throughout Cambodia.

Tuesday 6th January - Galashiels

Join with us in thanking God for our offer being accepted on a building. Please pray that the title issue can be resolved soon and we can get in next month.

Wednesday 7th January - Sashko, Poland

Our church in Kraków occupies a unique position: close enough to understand Ukraine's needs, stable enough to focus on long-term spiritual infrastructure, and connected enough to distribute literature effectively across the region. This is where Ukrainian Reformation was born. Operating from Poland, we're able to provide the sound theological resources Ukrainian believers desperately need while their own churches are necessarily focused on immediate crisis response. Please pray that the Lord would continue to bless and grow this work.

Thursday 8th January - Galashiels

We had our first joint Borders Youth Night in December and it was a huge success, far better than we anticipated. Please pray that this continues and specifically that Scripture Union Scotland can appoint a worker for the Borders who can take this on.

Friday 9th January - Muriel Macleod, Cambodia

Recently there has been a significant increase in hostilities between Thailand and Cambodia. More intense fighting and many more casualties, including five young men from the village. They were sent back home to the district medical centre to be near family as they recover. Pray for those reaching out to the increasing numbers of refugees. Pray for a peaceful resolution.

Saturday 10th January - Sashko, Poland

Our distribution infrastructure is already operational and reaching deep into Ukraine. Ministry partners we've carefully vetted are carrying our books directly to seminaries, churches, orphanages, displaced families and soldiers at the frontline — into bomb shelters, military hospitals, and refugee housing where theological resources are desperately needed. Please pray God's protection over this much needed distribution infrastructure.

Sunday 11th January - Galashiels

Please ask that the Lord might provide more mature Christians to the church plant. Specifically families and musicians.
