SUNDAY SERVICES

We are thankful to gather in the Church this Lord's Day for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and at 6.00pm. Both the services will be conducted in English and taken by the Minister.

Services this Sunday

At the 12.00noon service we will continue in a short study of Lessons from the Return from Exile in the Old Testament. The focus of the service this Lord's Day will be on Nehemiah 1:1-11 under the title The Need to Rebuild Kingdom Life. The focus of the service at 6.00pm will be on Psalm 106:1-5 under the title A Prayer for Covenant Blessing.

Psalm Singing

We have been blessed with the use of technology to assist us with our Psalm singing in our Sunday services since public worship was resumed after the COVID-19 lockdown. The Kirk Session has agreed to resume the practice of having the praise led by a Precentor and to discontinue the use of pre-recorded Psalm singing. The practice of the praise being led by a Precentor will be re-introduced on Sunday 19th September 2021.

COVID Restrictions

There is now no legal requirement for physical distancing in church services. However, we will continue to observe the one-metre physical distancing in our services in the meantime to help allay people's anxieties in public gatherings in the light of the ongoing presence of the COVID-19. People attending church services are still required to wear face coverings except for children under the age of 12. In accordance with the revised guidance and recommendations issued on Friday 27th August 2021, we will continue the practice of taking a register of all those attending our services.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

The Sunday School will meet in person in the Hall again this Lord's Day. According to the normal practice, the young people will be in the Church service from 12.00noon until leaving the service for the Sunday School at approximately 12.15pm. The teachers will ensure that all relevant COVID-19 guidance is observed.

We note the concerns over COVID-19 in the School this week and the need for some of our young people to isolate. We expect, therefore, to have a limited number in Sunday School today but arrangements are in place so that those who are isolating at home can join the Sunday School on Zoom. We assure parents and young people that we will be vigilant in the observance of all COVID-19 restrictions and public health guidelines. We pray for all our young people, and for all School staff, that they will all be kept at this time.

SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Kirk Session met on Wednesday 8th September to review the provisional appointment of Sunday 25th September 2021 for in-house Communion and the observance of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Having noted the current rise on COVID-19 cases, the ongoing COVID-19 restrictions, and the relatively low attendance on the Lord's Day, it was agreed to postpone the Communion arrangements and to review the matter next month. We regret that we were not able to observe the Sacrament on Sunday 5th September as we would have

done according to our normal programme. We trust and pray that the way will be clear for us to sit at the Lord's Table as the people of God in the near future.

WEEKLY PRAYER & BIBLE STUDY

The weekly Prayer and Bible Study meeting will take place in the Church at 7.00pm this Wednesday, 15th September 2021. Those who wish to attend are reminded that Bibles and Psalms Books will not be available at the door during the current COVID-19 restrictions. A register of those attending the meeting will be taken at the door. The Minister is due to be in Edinburgh from Wednesday to Friday this week to attend a meeting of the Board of Trustees, and to attend to other duties, and will, therefore, not be present at the Prayer Meeting.
