## ATTENDANCE AT SUNDAY SERVICES

We are thankful to gather in the Church this Lord's Day, 16<sup>th</sup> May 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English. We encourage all our people to join with us in the worship of God each Lord's Day.

#### **Coronavirus Protection Level I**

We are thankful to the Lord that in the Western Isles we move into Level I of Scottish Government COVID-19 restrictions from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2021. The restrictions for attendance at church services remains as per the changes introduced on 26<sup>th</sup> April with the movement towards a building capacity limit while observing the 2metre physical distancing rules. The move into Level I also means that there is a capacity limit of 100 for funerals and weddings provided the venue's capacity allows for 2 metre physical distancing.

## **Ongoing Registration**

The introduction of a capacity limit instead of the cap of 50 people attending Church services is unlikely to affect the maximum number we can accommodate in the Church until such time as the upstairs is opened for use. Seats will, therefore, continue to be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. The arrangements for registering your intention to attend the services, and to complete the relevant documentation, have been set up on the Congregational Website <u>here</u>.

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

#### PASTORAL VISITATION

The announcement of the Scottish Government that the Western Isles will move into Protection Level 1 of COVID-19 restrictions on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2021 brings about welcome changes in the rules regarding socialising and mixing with family and friends. We can meet socially in groups of up to 6 people from 3 households in your home or theirs.

This means that limited pastoral visitation in homes is now possible. Pastoral visits will be carried out by the Minister and the Elders at their own discretion and subject to family and household arrangements as required. The new Moderator will be appointed at the first Session on Monday evening and the Assembly will meet for a further four Sessions, with two Sessions per day on Tuesday and Wednesday.
