LORD'S DAY SERVICES - CHURCH RE-OPENING

We are thankful to gather in the Church this Lord's Day, 18th April 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English.

We welcome the announcement of the Scottish Government that the whole of Scotland will move into Protection Level 3 of COVID-19 restrictions. The cap of 50 people attending a Church service is to be removed and replaced by a capacity limit. The capacity limit will be determined for each individual building, based on the 2-metre physical distancing rules and other current restrictions and controls. This will enable larger buildings, with greater floor area and seating capacity, to accommodate more while still maintaining the 2-metre physical distancing. The numbers permitted to attend funerals and wedding services is also to be increased to a maximum of 50 from 26th April.

Church Attendance

The introduction of a capacity limit instead of the cap of 50 people attending Church services is unlikely to affect the maximum number we can accommodate in the Church until such time as the upstairs is opened for use. Seats will, therefore, continue to be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. Mr Donald MacPhail, Deacon, is the Seating Coordinator for the Church services and enquiries regarding attendance should in the first place be directed to him.

Ongoing Registration

The arrangements for registering your intention to attend the services, and to complete the relevant documentation, have been set up on the Congregational Website here. If you are unable to return the Data Collection Form electronically, provision is made for you to deposit it at the Church door as you enter for the Service.

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

We will continue to use the Sermon Audio site for audio recordings and, once the live stream equipment setup is fully functional, we will use the Sermon Audio Webcast function to live stream the services to both platforms.

STIRLING FREE CHURCH

The congregation of Stirling Free Church is bringing a legal action for religious discrimination against multimillion pound organisation, The Robertson Trust. The Congregation had an agreement with The Robertson Trust for the use of its premises in The Barracks Conference Centre for Sunday services. The Trust's former CEO, Mr Kenneth Ferguson, an Elder of Stirling Free Church, was sacked when the Chairwoman, Shonaig Macpherson, heard that Stirling Free Church was renting Trust premises for its Sunday services. The Congregation had its contract terminated and was ordered to leave the Conference Centre, with the Trust claiming it had a policy of not renting for activities promoting religion.

Mr Ferguson brought his own case against the Trust and was heard in the Glasgow Employment Tribunal from Monday 14 to Thursday 17 December. The hearing did not conclude and will resume on 10 May. The case brought by Stirling Free Church will be heard on 19, 20 and 23 April 2021. We pray for the Congregation, and particularly for the Minister, Rev. Iain MacAskill, and Mr Ferguson, who have been called as witnesses.

PRESBYTERY PRAYER TIME

The Bible passage and prayer points for Monday 19th April 2021 have been chosen by the **Rev. Iain MacRitchie**, Minister at Pairc (Gravir). The Bible Passage is **John Chapter 3** and the following are the prayer points.

Prayer Points:

- 1. Give thanks to God for the unmatched hope that we find in the words of John 3:16. Pray that during these days many more in our communities would come to know the wonderful implications of believing in the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2. As God's Word is preached through a variety of platforms, pray that this Word may be powerfully accompanied by the Holy Spirit, applying it in a life changing way to the hearts of men, women, boys and girls.
- 3. Pray for God's people, the Church, at this time. Pray that we might strive daily to see afresh the wonder of the sacrificial act of love that was carried out on our behalf and consequently be compelled to share this good news with others.
- 4. Give thanks for the privilege of now being able to physically meet together and worship God. Give thanks for the sense of community that belongs to God's people and pray that this will be strengthened and nurtured in the days ahead.
- 5. Pray for those who are unable to join together in this way, that the Lord would draw close to them and strengthen them to overcome any fears or anxieties they may have.
- 6. Pray congregations who are unable to re-open, that practical solutions would be found in due course.
- 7. Give thanks for the easing of COVID restrictions. Pray that as we ease out of lockdown, the virus will remain suppressed and that we will not see another outbreak. Give thanks to God for the gifts that He has equipped men and women with in producing vaccines.
- 8. Continue to pray for the Royal Family and in particular Her Majesty the Queen, as they continue to mourn the death of Prince Philip. Pray that they would be strengthened and that they would find grace to help in time of need from the promises of God's Word.
