Accusing and Being Accused

Be ye angry and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath (Ephesians 4:26)

The Christian shouldn't begrudge another's good reputation, nor gloat over anyone's defects; filled with Christ's love, he should weep and be downcast at his brother's failings, and rejoice over his brother's good accomplishments. He shouldn't be unconcerned or silent toward those who are at fault. But whoever points out another's sin must act with all gentleness, in the fear of God, and with one purpose – the sinner's repentance. The sinner who is convicted or rebuked should accept it gladly, realising that his correction is for his benefit. When an accusation is being made, no one should contradict the accuser; but if someone thinks the accusation is wrong, he should speak to the accuser privately, and either convince him, or be convinced. If someone has a complaint against you, do everything you can to make peace with that person.

No one should nurse a grudge against a repentant sinner, but forgive him totally. Whoever says he has repented should not just be inwardly pricked with sorrow for what he did, but display fruits demonstrating repentance. Whoever has been set right for committing a sin for the first time, and received forgiveness, if he sins again, stores up for himself a judgment of indignation greater than before. Whoever keeps sinning after the first and second admonition should be brought before someone in authority, so that an official rebuke may perhaps make him more ashamed. If even this doesn't set him right, he must be cut off from the fellowship as a stumbling block, and treated as a Pagan and a tax collector (Matt. 18:17)... The sun shouldn't set on a brother's anger (Eph. 4:26), in case the night falls between brother and brother, and then, when the day of judgment dawns, accusation prevails.
