# LORD'S DAY SERVICES – CHURCH RE-OPENING

We are thankful to gather (DV) in the Church this Lord's Day, 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2021, for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and the Service will be conducted in English by Rev Donald A MacDonald (Retired, Kinloch).

We welcome that the whole of Scotland has moved into Protection Level 3 of COVID-19 restrictions. The cap of 50 people attending a Church service is removed and replaced by a capacity limit. The capacity limit is determined for each individual building, based on the 2-metre physical distancing rules and other current restrictions and controls. This enables larger buildings with greater floor area and seating capacity accommodate more while still maintaining the 2-metre physical distancing. The numbers permitted to attend funerals and wedding services is currently a maximum of 50.

# Church Attendance

The introduction of a capacity limit instead of the cap of 50 people attending Church services is unlikely to affect the maximum number we can accommodate in the Church until such time as the upstairs is opened for use. Seats will continue to be allocated according to household groups on a first come first served basis until such time as we reach the limit of fifty. Mr Donald MacPhail, Deacon, is the Seating Coordinator for the Church services and enquiries regarding attendance should in the first place be directed to him.

# **Ongoing Registration**

The arrangements for registering your intention to attend the services, and to complete the relevant documentation, have been set up on the Congregational Website <u>here</u>. If you are unable to return the Data Collection Form electronically, provision is made for you to deposit it at the Church door as you enter for the Service.

The deadline for submission of the names of those who wish to attend the service will be 12.00noon on Friday. Seats will be reserved on a weekly basis and you should, therefore, follow the same procedure for every Lord's Day service.

We will continue to use the Sermon Audio site for audio recordings and, once the live stream equipment setup is fully functional, we will use the Sermon Audio Webcast function to live stream the services to both platforms.

# **Availability of Services**

An audio recording of the English service in the Church will be available on Sermon Audio at 2.00pm. The service in Gaelic has been pre-recorded and will be available on Sermon Audio at 12.00noon. Services are accessed on the <u>Shawbost Free Church Sermon Audio</u> by simply clicking or tapping on Shawbost Free Church Sermon Audio underlined above from your phone, tablet, laptop, etc., to take you directly to the site.

The pre-recorded Gaelic Service will also be available on the Twilio service, which we have been using since March 2020, and which can be **accessed from landline / home telephone** by dialling the number **0131 510 2471**. Please note that there is <u>a delay of approximately 35 seconds</u> from the time at which the call is answered until the service commences.

#### PRESBYTERY PRAYER TIME

The Bible passage and prayer points for Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2021 have been chosen by **Rev. Paul Murray**, minister of the Kinloch congregation.

#### Bible Reading: Isaiah 64

#### **Prayer Points:**

- I. Give thanks that God has 'rent the Heavens' by sending His Son into the world to procure salvation for sinners, and His Holy Spirit to apply that salvation to sinners. (v1)
- 2. Pray that, as God has rent the Heavens at various points in the history of the Church in order to pour out a blessing on her, that He would do so again in our day. (v1)
- 3. Give thanks for the eternal blessing that God has prepared for those who love Him and wait upon Him. (v4)
- 4. Confess before God your personal sins, family sins, Church sins, and national sins. (v5-6)
- 5. Stir yourself up to take hold of God in prayer, and pray that God would raise up more praying people who will call upon His name. (v7)
- 6. Pray that God would turn His anger away from us as a nation, and lift His just judgment. (v9, 12)
- 7. Pray that the Church (Zion/Jerusalem), which appears to many to be a wilderness and a desolation, might become like the garden of the Lord (Isaiah 51:3) and that 'joy and gladness shall be found therein, thanksgiving, and the voice of melody.' (v10-11)
