THE EARLY CHURCH FATHERS - ST AMBROSE OF MILAN (339-97)

I, even I, am He that blotteth out thy transgression for Mine own sake and will not remember thy sins. (Isaiah 43:25)

Let's submit ourselves to God, and not live under sin's power. In remembering our past transgressions, let's blush as at some scandal, and not speak of them as a credit to us, as some brag of conquering modesty or crushing their sense of justice. We should be so thoroughly converted, that we who once didn't know God now proclaim Him to others. The Lord, seeing this conversion, will answer us: "Ephraim is from youth a dear son, a pleasant child. Since My words are in him, I will surely remember him. Therefore I hastened to help him; I will surely have mercy on him, says the LORD" (Jer. 31:20, Septuagint). The Lord also shows us the mercy He promises us: "I have saturated every thirsty soul, and satisfied every hungry soul. Therefore I awoke and beheld, and my sleep was sweet to me" (Jer. 31:25-26, Septuagint). We notice the Lord promises His sacraments to sinners.² So let us all be converted to the Lord!

If no one else is converted, however, make sure you repent; you have fallen from purity and faith's high peak by many stumbles. We have a kind Lord, whose desire is to pardon all. He called you through Isaiah: "I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions, and I will not remember them. But you remember, and we will plead together" (Isa. 43:25-26, Septuagint). He says, "I won't remember, but you remember." That is, "I don't recall your transgressions which I've forgiven, sunk into My forgetfulness, as it were. But you should remember them. I won't remember them because of My grace. You should remember them to correct yourself, to know the sin is forgiven. Don't boast of innocence; this will worsen the sin. Confess your sin and be justified!" A chastened confession of sins undoes the chains of transgression
