GEORGE WHITEFIELD ON: THE SON'S SUBMISSION

In the story of Abraham travelling up Moriah to offer his son Isaac, do you read of Isaac carrying the wood upon his shoulders up the mountain? Let this lead you to Mount Calvary (this very mountain of Moriah where Isaac is offered, as some would think and take a view of the antitype, Jesus the Son of God, bearing and ready to sink under the weight of that cross on which he was to hang for us. Do you admire Isaac for so freely consenting to die, though a creature, and therefore obliged to go where God called? Do not forget to admire infinitely more the dear Lord Jesus Christ, who willingly said, "Behold, I have come," though under no obligation to do so, "to do your will" to obey and die for men, "O God," (Heb 10:7)! Look by faith at our all-glorious Emmanuel, unbound, but nailed on an accursed tree; see how he hangs, crowned with thorns, enduring the derision of those around him; see how the thorns pierce him, and how the blood in purple streams trickles down his sacred temples! Hark how the God of nature groans! See how he bows his head, and at length humanity gives up the ghost! Isaac is saved, but Jesus has no substitute. Jesus must bleed; Jesus must die. God the Father provided this Lamb for himself from all eternity. We have been the betrayers and the murderers of this Lord of glory. Having been so much forgiven, shall we not love much? O, let us love him with all our hearts, minds, and strength, and glorify him in our solus and bodies, for they are his.
