BINDING BROKENNESS

'Binding Brokenness' is the local expression of a Bible-based trauma healing ministry using a small group resource produced by the Trauma Healing Institute and the Scottish Bible Society. Mairianne Campbell (Stornoway Free Church) and Joanna George (St Peter's Episcopal Church) work together as facilitators of this material, which is simply a resource for churches to help those who have been hurt by difficulties in life.

The material combines the best practice mental health principles with Bible-based discussion and activities to allow participants to explore how to begin to heal from trauma. The group is confidential, and participants only share what they are comfortable sharing of their own experience. The course begins with an introductory welcome lesson on Thursday 3rd February and runs weekly each Thursday evening until 17th March, God willing.
