## Monday 24th June - Turkey

# THE EARLY CHURCH FATHERS: ST JEROME (347-420) Reading for 23 June – Traps Laid by the Tongue

Whoso keepeth his mouth and his tongue keepeth his soul from trouble (Proverbs 21:23)

Don't fish for praises. You might gain people's applause, but offend God. "If I still pleased men," Paul says, "I would not be Christ's servant" (Gal. 1:10). When he became Christ's servant, Paul stopped pleasing men. Christ's soldier goes marching on through praise on the right hand, blame on the left. Applause doesn't thrill him, criticism doesn't crush him. He isn't lifted up by riches, nor depressed by poverty. He treats joy and sorrow with equal disdain. The sun doesn't smite him by day nor the moon by night.

Don't pray at the street-corners, in case human applause disturbs the straight path of your prayers. Don't enlarge the borders of your garments and wear phylacteries for display, nor cloak yourself in the Pharisee's self-parading, contrary to conscience. Do you want to know how the Lord would see you clothed? With wisdom, fairmindedness, self-control, courage. Let these encircle your horizon; let them be a four-horse team to carry you, Christ's charioteer, at top speed to your finishing-line. There's no necklace more costly than these; no precious stones form a more dazzling constellation. These adorn you, gird you, safeguard you on every side. They are your protection as well as your glory; every gem becomes a shield. And beware the gossiping tongue and itching ears! Neither criticise others nor listen to critics. The psalmist says, "You sit and speak against your brother; you slander your own mother's son. These things you have done and I kept silence; you thought wickedly that I was just like yourself, but I will rebuke you and set your sins in order before your eyes" (Ps. 50:20-21). Hold your tongue from complaining; watch your words. Realise that in condemning others, you pass sentence on yourself: you are guilty of the very defects you charge against them.
