INTRODUCTION

We are a congregation of the Free Church of Scotland. We gather for public worship on the Lord's Day at 12.00noon and at 6.00pm. We use the ESV version of the Bible in the public worship of God. We use both the Scottish Psalter and Sing Psalms versions of the Psalms for the praise items in our public worship. SUNDAY SERVICES

We will continue our series of sermons on some of the promises of the coming of the Son of God into the world and how these promises unfold in the New Testament. The title of the series is *The Unfolding of God's Promises in the Life of Jesus*.

Today we will study Isaiah 11:1-5 and look at the birth of Jesus and the way in which he was prepared and equipped to fulfil the mission of God. The sermon title is 'The Promise of a King & The Mission of God.'

The **6.00pm service** today will be taken by Rev. Thomas Davis. The message will be from John 1:1-18. The title of the sermon is 'Was. With. Became.'

PRAYING FOR ONE ANOTHER

The following are prayer points issued by the Mission Board under the Praying For One Another Scheme (PFOA) in the past week.

Monday - Stirling Free Church

Thanks for togetherness as a new ministry has begun. Grateful for the venue we have for Sunday services at Bannockburn High School. Nonetheless, we are seeking a building of our own from which to reach out to the city of Stirling, and in which we may grow in faith and fellowship.

Tuesday - Turkey

If they think about the holiday at all, Turks usually associate Christmas with Santa Claus and shopping. Pray for Turkish television channels which will show Christian films at this time of year, and for churches and ministries in the country trying to spread the Good News about Christ's coming into the world.

Wednesday - Scalpay (Harris)

Pray for God's blessing on the seed sown during the Christianity Explored course held in November & December. All of those helping as "leaders" have themselves come to faith in the past decade, about half of them through previous Christianity Explored courses.

Thursday - Richard and Barbara, a European City

The large island community here, and elsewhere in the diaspora, generally does not mix much with others. Pray the Lord of the harvest to send workers into this harvest field. May islanders come into meaningful contact with true Christians; may churches and Christians be motivated to share with their island neighbours.

Friday - Turkey

It has become more difficult for foreigners to obtain residence permits in Turkey. Pray for foreign Christians who are involved in ministries in the country, that it would be possible for them to continue to live there.

Saturday - Scalpay (Harris)

Scalpay is engaged in the process of buying its own building, which will then need considerable refurbishment. Pray that these property matters would progress smoothly and successfully, and that the hoped-for refurbishment would become a means of involving others who may be on the fringe of the congregation.

Sunday - Christmas Day

Pray that as believers come and remember Christ's birth this Christmas, that the light of the gospel will shine to unbelievers about the true meaning of Christmas. Give thanks to God for giving His Son, to be born on earth as fully man and fully God who is our Saviour.
