UPDATE FROM CONGRGEATIONAL MEETING

At the meeting last Wednesday evening, the name of Rev. Paul Murray was proposed by the Vacancy Committee. Opportunity was given for any members present to propose other nominations, but none were forthcoming. A vote was taken to ascertain support for Rev. Paul Murray and there was a strong majority in favour. Adherents were then asked if they were supportive and again there was a strong majority. As such, the Kirk Session requested that the Western Isles Presbytery make arrangements for the call to be processed and a meeting has been set by them for **Wednesday 11th February at 7pm**. An edict stating such will be read at the services on the 1st and 8th of February. At the meeting, members and adherents will be asked to sign the call. Any members and adherents who cannot be present that evening can show their support of a call by signing a mandate form. Should you require one of these forms, or know someone else who does, please speak to any of the elders or deacons and they will make arrangements for this. We continue to pray for the Lord's will to be done in all of this.
