SERVICES NEXT LORD'S DAY

PRAYER MEETING AND BIBLE STUDY

The prayer meeting and Bible study will take place on **Wednesday 30**th **April at 7pm in Bragar.** Everyone is most welcome and encouraged to attend.

PRESBYTERY OVERSIGHT VISIT (QUINQUENNIAL)

On **Wednesday 28th May**, there will be a Presbytery Oversight Visit (POV) from the Presbytery of the Western Isles, who have the responsibility for the wider pastoral and spiritual oversight of Shawbost Free Church. As part of this oversight, the Presbytery is required to meet with each congregation within its bounds once every five years. The purpose of the visitation is to provide an opportunity and basis for a conversation and conference with the congregation and its office-bearers so as to strengthen, confirm and encourage them in the Lord's service, and to provide them with an opportunity for self-assessment and examination of the work of the Church in the local area. The goal of the process is to challenge congregations to take prudent measures to build up the cause of Christ in fulfilling the great Gospel commission. The whole process is not in any way meant to be inquisitorial, but simply an opportunity to reflect and pray about the ongoing progress of the Gospel in the congregation.

The Presbytery would like to receive comments from the Congregation through a questionnaire in order to complete the consultation process. Once completed, the questionnaire will be returned to the Presbytery Visitation Committee. All questionnaires must be signed, and anonymous questionnaires will be discarded. There will also be an opportunity for the Congregation to make their views known to the Committee on the day of the visit at the Congregational Meeting. Questionnaire forms are available at the door and should be returned **by Lord's Day II th May**. Monday 28th April - Cornerstone

GATHER THE FRAGMENTS..... (J.R. MILLER)

"Gather the fragments that are left over. Let nothing be wasted!" (John 6:12)

It seems remarkable, that He who so easily could multiply the five loaves into an abundant meal for thousands, should be so particular about 'saving the fragments'. But Jesus would teach us economy. No matter how great our abundance, we should take care of the 'fragments'. After we have eaten at our tables, there are hungry people who would be glad for the pieces that are left over.

This applies also to the fragments of <u>time</u>. Many busy people waste whole years of time in their life, in the minutes which they lose every day! If at the end of a year they could gather up all these 'fragments', they would have many basketfuls of golden time in which they might do much good!

Likewise, we should not waste our <u>strength.</u> Many people waste their bodily energy, using it in play, or useless amusements—when it belongs to God, and ought to be employed to its last particle for His glory!
