SUNDAY SERVICES

We are thankful to gather in the Church this Lord's Day for the public worship of God. We meet at 12.00noon and at 6.00pm. Both the services will be conducted by the Minister.

The Services

At the 12.00noon service we will commence a short study of Lesson from the Return from Exile as we resume normal service on the Lord's Day and resume in-person meetings of the Sunday School. The focus of the service this Lord's Day will be on Ezra 3:13 and The Restoration of Biblical Worship.

The focus of the service at 6.00pm will be on Psalm 80:1-13 and A Prayer for a Return to Normal.

COVID Restrictions

There is now no legal requirement for physical distancing in church services. However, we will continue to observe the one-metre physical distancing in our services in the meantime to help allay people's anxieties in public gatherings in the light of the ongoing presence of the COVID-19. People attending church services are still required to wear face coverings except for children under the age of 12. Registration for attendance at services is not required at this present time.

Kiltarlity, Beauly & Kirkhill

Prayer Points:

- 1. Please pray for a venue. As a new congregation we don't have our own building, and this has been especially challenging over lockdown and as things restrictions ease but many buildings (esp. those owned by the council which we were using) remain closed. Please pray that a larger venue would open so we can move from 2 smaller services to all worshipping together and being able to run creche and Kids' Church classes as well. Please also pray that when the time is right God would provide us with a longer term home which we could use for ministry throughout the week as well as on Sundays.
- 2. Please pray that as a church and as individuals we would make good connections with the local community and have opportunities to share the gospel with them. As restrictions do ease please pray for wisdom to know where to direct energy and resources to serve our community and communicate the good news of Jesus with them. And that in all this God would through his Spirit open the eyes of many to see their need of Jesus as their saviour.
