Monday 1st July - Livingston

THE EARLY CHURCH FATHERS: ST JEROME (347-420) Humility and Pride

Yea, all of you be subject one to another, and be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble. Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time. (1 Peter 5:5-6)

While the disciples were squabbling about who was greatest, our Lord, the Teacher of humility, took a little child and said: "Unless you are converted and become as little children, you cannot enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 18:3). In case He might seem to preach more than He practised, He obeyed His own command in His own life. He washed His disciples' feet; He welcomed the betrayer Judas with a kiss; He spoke freely with the Samaritan woman; He taught about the kingdom of heaven as Mary sat at His feet; and when He rose from the dead, He revealed Himself first of all to some lowly women.

Pride is the opposite of humility. It was through pride that Satan lost his exalted position as an archangel. It was through pride that the Jewish people perished; while they were claiming the foremost seats and respectful greetings in the market place, they were passed over in favour of the Gentiles, who up until then had been reckoned as a mere drop in a bucket (Isa. 40:15). Two insignificant fishermen, Peter and James, were sent out to challenge the false reasoners and wise men of the world. As Scripture says: "God opposes the proud and gives grace to the humble" (1 Pet. 5:5). Think, my brother, what a terrible sin it must be which has God Himself as its Enemy! In the Gospel, God casts aside the Pharisee because of his pride, but embraces the tax-collector because of his humility (Luke 18:10-14).
