MISSIONARY SLOT

In our missionary slot this weekend we focus on the UN Climate Change Conference UK 2021 to be held in Glasgow this coming week. The negative impact of climate change on our world and on God's creation is undeniable and aspects of this negative impact are highlighted in the various media daily to increase awareness of it. Perhaps the impact is greater in parts of the world where much of the Church's missionary endeavour takes place and where poverty, famine and disease can be so prevalent.

Rev. Martin Patterson, involved in global mission and the Church's Global Mission Advisor, has written an article on where he explains why Christians should care about environmental issues. Martin says – 'in the coming weeks world leaders will gather in Glasgow for COP26 to discuss the global climate emergency. Though there are questions surrounding the events economic efficiency and environmental impact, discussions about the Earth's climate are necessary. A brief glance back to the flash flooding in China and Europe, or videos of the Blade Runner-like cityscapes of California remind us why. For disciples of Christ in Scotland there is a question we need to ask about these talks. With the world looking at the city of Glasgow, how should we engage with COP26?'
