LORD'S DAY SERVICES - CHURCH CLOSED

There is no change regarding Scottish Government's COVID-19 restrictions for Western Isles. This means we are still in Level 4 and there is a legal requirement for places of worship located within an area having Level 4 restrictions to close for communal worship and individual prayer. This, of course, means that we will not be able to meet for public worship in the Church until there is a relaxation in the COVID-19 restrictions.

The Lord's Supper

It is with a sense of sadness and regret we note that, in normal circumstances, we would have our Communion Services this weekend and the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper would be observed on the Lord's Day. The elements of bread and wine in the Lord's Supper represent and exhibit Christ as the spiritual nourishment of our souls. The words of the Larger Catechism 169 give a concise and precise statement of what the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is – 'The Lord's supper is a sacrament of the New Testament, wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine according to the appointment of Jesus Christ, his death is showed forth; and they that worthily communicate feed upon his body and blood, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace; have their union and communion with him confirmed; testify and renew their thankfulness, and engagement to God, and their mutual love and fellowship each with other, as members of the same mystical body.'

To reflect on what the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper means, as it was instituted by the Lord Jesus in His Word, highlights how great our loss is when we are unable to gather around Word and Sacrament and be encouraged in the Lord. Our prayer is that in such lockdown times, when we are unable to gather for public worship, and unable to sit at the Lord's Table for communion, that the Lord will bless us and strengthen our faith through the alternative means available to us at this time.

Dingwall & Strathpeffer Free Church covers one of the largest Geographic parishes in the denomination and extends from Dingwall on the Cromarty Firth through Strathpeffer, Contin, Garve, Lochliuchart over to Achnasheen in the West. The congregation, under normal circumstances gathers in Dingwall with 6 home groups which gather throughout the congregation. We now gather on Zoom. Our congregation represents about 1% of the overall parish population. Dingwall is the political centre of the district with a population of under 6,000.

Charleston Community Church

Charleston Community Church is a plant of St Peter's Free Church in Dundee. The church is situated in Charleston's old Post Office, making it a noticeable and valuable part of the community. Charleston is a scheme riddled with issues such as drug abuse, violence, and poverty, but the biggest issue is a lack of Gospel witness in the community. Summer 2021 will mark three years for the small but growing plant.

Prayer Points:

- 1. Please pray for the planting team, specifically Andy and Caireen, as they seek to share the gospel in Charleston and encounter the difficulties of ministry in a scheme context, especially during these days of lockdown
- 2. Please pray for the church as it looks towards the future. Pray that God will save many through the work of Charleston Community Church, and that by this He will allow the church to continue as a gospel witness in Charleston.

Covenant Church, Newmilns

Newmilns is in East Ayrshire, about half an hour South of Glasgow. Covenant Church was formed in 2013 and joined the Free Church in May 2015. Our minister, Benj, has been here since graduating from ETS in 2017. The congregation has a spread of ages, including a good number of both Primary and Secondary age children. We meet in the Morton Hall on the Main Street.

Prayer Points:

- 1. Making the most of opportunities. It's hard responding to ever changing restrictions, especially quickly enough to do something before it shifts. Pray for wisdom, for example, deciding whether to run another online Christianity Explored course, or wait to meet in person.
- 2. We have put in an offer to buy an old supermarket building. At time of writing our bid is under consideration. Please pray it would be looked upon favourably, and that wherever we meet our focus will be on proclaiming Christ to our needy community not on the building.

Dr Carl Trueman to Deliver Annual ETS Church History Lecture

Dr Carl Trueman will deliver this year year's Annual Church History Lecture organised by Edinburgh Theological Seminary (ETS) on **Thursday 4 March at 2:30pm.** The title of Dr Trueman's lecture will be "The Other Genevan: Rousseau and the Rise of the Modern Mind". This year's lecture will take a detour from its regular Scottish theme and make use of the opportunity that technology affords within current Covid 19 restrictions, to focus on the link between past and modern thought.

Carl R. Trueman is a graduate of the Universities of Cambridge (MA, Classics) and Aberdeen (PhD, Church History). Originally a Reformation specialist, his most recent work has been in the areas of modernity, selfhood, and identity politics. He currently serves as professor of Biblical and Religious Studies at Grove City College, PA. He is the author or editor of over a dozen books, most recently *The Rise and Triumph of the Modern Self* (Crossway) and the forthcoming *Oxford Handbook of Calvin and Calvinism* (co-edited with Bruce Gordon).

He also writes for First Things and Public Discourse. He is married to Catriona and has two adult children.
